No doubt many of you are aware of some of the risks these social networking websites may pose to our students. Incidents of cyber-bullying, threats of violence, and Internet sexual predators have become all too common in recent years, and schools nationwide have witnessed a sharp increase in disciplinary actions based on information posted by students on websites or transmitted through other electronic media.
